# What we've done in 2023-2025

1

## Upholding the SSO

**Recommendations** and watching publishers' activities on authentication. Providing information for patrons/students about using SSO for library resources, usable to create an infographic.

2

**Open Access talks** about whether FIM4L could help with FIM in the Open Science ecosystem with “managed access” for Open Access resources.

3

**Managed Access use cases for Open Science** listed in a blogpost on the LIBER website.

4

**Representing FIM4L at conferences** like last year with a poster session at LIBER conference.

5

**Monitoring digital wallets development** and following Verifiable Credentials developments.

# Manage access where open or public access is not permitted

## Use cases for access management on Open Access publication platforms:

- Geo location restrictions
- Citizenship limitations
- Age limitations
- Knowledge security / Sensitive information

## Use cases for access management in Open Science scholarly communication:

### Data processing state

- Secure collaboration infrastructure
- Citizen science with managed identities
- University presses identity management

### Data/material publishing state

- Repositories
- University presses

### Digital Wallets open up new issues

- What attributes to share?
  - What sources of those attributes to trust?
- Verifiable credentials
- Privacy preserving authorisations



# What is going on?

## Diamond Open Access

Libraries like moving to “university presses” to cut the costs of Open Access publishing.

## Repositories: more autonomy

Libraries are looking for more independent storage and discovery for own academic output.

## EU initiatives

E.g. EOSC and OpenAlex are gaining traction. Libraries dare to cancel Scopus or WoS. Support for more digital sovereignty.

## Open Science ecosystem

Using PID's like ORCID. Collaboration infrastructure, peer-to-peer review, OpenAIRE etc.
